

















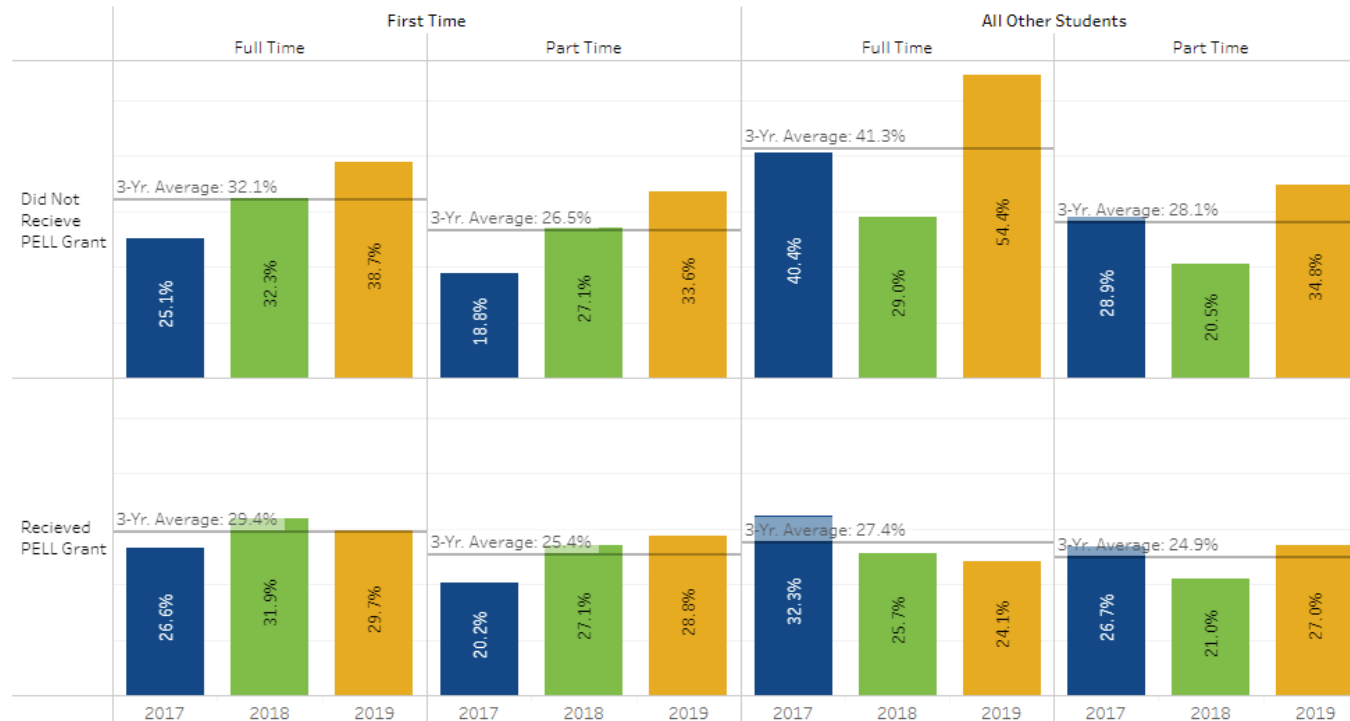

## 8-Year Graduation Rate by PELL Recipient Status

The data show that students that did not receive Pell (30.9%) interestingly graduated with a higher three-year average rate than students who did receive Pell (28.3%). Among students that did not receive Pell, all other students (31.7%) performed higher than first-time students (28.7%); however, among students that did receive Pell, first-time students (28.0%) performed higher than all other students (26.5%). Full-time students, despite having received Pell or not, showed higher three-year average graduation rates overall. All other part-time students that did not receive Pell showed the lowest three-year average graduation rate (24.9%), while all other full-time students that did not receive Pell showed the highest three-year average graduation rate (41.3%).
