Gwinnett Tech Foundation Has Raised \$1.9 Million Over Past Two Years to Empower Education

hanks to the dedication and commitment of Gwinnett Tech Foundation high-quality educational opportunities preparing students for Georgia's most high-demand jobs are more accessible than ever before. The Foundation has been working diligently behind the scenes the last two years to build scholarship funds by more than \$1.9 million to knock down barriers and open doors to success for students across the North Georgia region.

Sophia Pittman, Executive Director of Advancement for the Gwinnett Tech Foundation shares, "Gwinnett Technical College is one of the largest in the Technical College System of Georgia, so our Foundation must work intently to stay ahead of the curve to meet the growing, ever-changing needs of our students. Our students are some of the brightest and best in our state and we don't want financial barriers to ever keep them from reaching their full potential. Attending a technical college is a game changer. Here at Gwinnett Tech we believe in sustaining our

students by providing the tools they need to be successful."

Over the past two years 1,065 students have been positively impacted by the Foundation through scholarships, grants and emergency assistance. For the 2021 and 2022 academic years, the funds have allowed the award of 287 scholarships.

Pittman shares, "These scholarships and awards have been so critical to our students, especially over the past two years. Many had significant financial setbacks, job losses, and health disruptions due to the pandemic. Some needed to retool their skills or gain new certifications to make them more marketable. Others realized just how short and fragile life can be and decided to finally pursue their dream career. It's been powerful to see how our scholarships were the hope, encouragement, and inspiration students needed to not just survive, but thrive."
