A Message from the President

2020 will certainly be a year we will never forget. After beginning the academic year 2020 in the fall of 2019, the college had set records for enrollment, adult education, and economic development activity. Then, on March 16, 2020, the college, the state, and the nation shut down operations due to a pandemic not seen in over 100 years. However, within a week, we transitioned to delivering academic excellence through 100% virtual and online methods to finish the spring semester. Students with required and essential hands-on, in-person program requirements were asked to wait and give the college time to prepare a plan to safely deliver those needed experiences. Our faculty and staff in those programs more than rose to the occasion, and in May, we began delivering in-person, hands-on lab experiences for our students. Our facilities department implemented safety protocols and operations to allow the college to resume providing the necessary environment to bring back faculty and staff in a limited, but effective manner while teleworking became as much a part of our college environment as online instruction.






