**ACCELERATED
CAREER**



- Students in 10th, 11th and 12th grades attending Georgia public, private, or homeschool programs
- College courses counts as high school credit
- College program of study does NOT have to be completed by high school graduation

ELIGIBILITY



- Students in 10th, 11th and 12th grades attending Georgia PUBLIC high school only
- Completion of nine high school credits – 2 English, 2 math and science, 2 social studies and 1 health/PE
AND (simultaneously)
- Completion of college program – Associates degree OR diploma OR 2 technical certificates by the student's high school graduation date.

 - Music, arts, HWPS and FYES
 - Repeats, two withdrawals
 - 10th graders CTAE courses only

- Covers tuition, mandatory fees, and required textbooks
- Pays for all courses listed in the program of study chosen
